Carried out by I-Panels amongst 615 respondents composing a representative sample of the general Israeli population

1. In your opinion, is the continuation of the current situation without any progress with the Palestinians good or bad for Israel?

2. In ten more years, what in your opinion will happen between Israel and the Palestinians?

Israel will annex the Territories	12%	11.2%	7%	11.9%
Israel will unilaterally withdraw from most of the Territories	10.4%	9.3%	11%	10.2%
Israel and the Palestinians will reach a permanent agreement	8.9%	23.4%	9%	11.4%
The situation will be the same as it is today	53.7%	37.4%	60%	50.9%
Don't know	15%	18.7%	13%	15.6%



3. From the options above, what would you prefer to happen in the next ten years?

4. Which of the following options do you prefer as a solution to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict?

One-State with less rights for Palestinians	36.2%	4.7%	35%	26%

If a permanent agreement includes Palestinians recognizing Israel as the state of the Jewish people, reaching security arrangements accepted by Israel, and declaring the end of the conflict, and if Israel agrees to a nearly complete withdrawal to '67 lines while retaining settlement blocks, accepting a symbolic number of refugees, and giving up the Arab neighborhoods in East Jerusalem, would you support or oppose this agreement?
