


Geneva Initiative & Adva Center Poll

September 2020

Below are the results of a **Two-State Index** poll commissioned by the Geneva Initiative and the Adva Center, conducted by the Midgam Institute led by Mano Geva. The poll included 504 respondents representing the general population in Israel over the age of 18, with a margin of error of 4.3%, and was conducted in the third week of September 2020.

“The Israeli public understands that even during the corona days, a peace process with the Palestinians is needed and, that it may even help in dealing with the current crisis,” says Gadi Baltiansky, Israeli Director-General of the Geneva Initiative. *“The call is clear: after the Gulf states, now it’s time to talk to our immediate neighbors.”*


Do you support or oppose the renewal of negotiations with Palestinians on the basis of the two-state solution?



Almost a third of the population that self-defines as right-wing (31.5%) and Likud voters (29%) also supports this.


61% of secular Israelis support it, in contrast to 23% of religious Israelis

With whom would you most prefer the State of Israel to make a peace agreement next?



Right-wing Israelis and Likud voters put Qatar in first place (32% and 26% respectively).

In your opinion, are the high levels of education and welfare budget for settlements relative to other communities within the green line justified or unjustified?



Among Likud voters as well, a decided majority believe that it is unjustified (54% compared to 28%)

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
