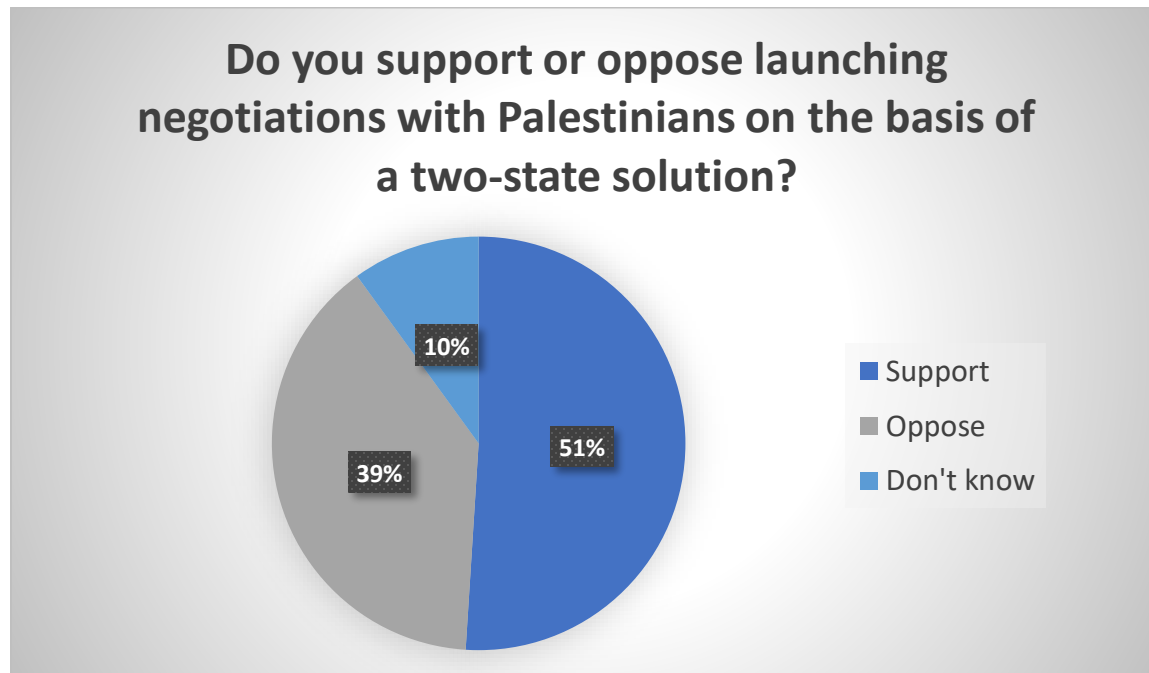

What do Israelis really think about the two-state solution?

In the Geneva Initiative public opinion poll carried out this month by the professional polling company Midgam, the two-state solution remains by far the preferred outcome to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. The majority of Israelis believe that the current “status quo” situation with regards to Israeli-Palestinian relations is bad for Israel, support resumption of negotiations on the basis of a two-state solution, and would like to see President Biden take an active role in promoting such a process.

Do you support or oppose launching negotiations with Palestinians on the basis of a two-state solution?

Support: 51%

Oppose: 39%
