




The Palestinian Pulse




What solution do you prefer for the Palestinian-Israeli conflict?








Do you think the US administration is serious about its repeated declarations about reaching a two-state solution?








Do you support a return to Palestinian-Israeli peace negotiations in order to achieve a two-state solution under international and Arab auspices?








In your view, what is the best means of achieving Palestinian goals in ending the occupation and building an independent state?








In your opinion, has the war on Gaza since

statehood?










Are you more optimistic or less optimistic today about the return of Palestinian-Israeli relations to what they were before October 7, and the return of workers to work in Israel?
