



Geneva Initiative Poll – August 2024

This public opinion survey, commissioned by the Geneva Initiative, was carried out among a representative sample of the Israeli public by the professional polling company Midgam in August 2024. The survey sample size was 501, with a margin of error of +4.4%.

1. Of the following options, which solution do you prefer to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict?

- Two states for two peoples – 37.2%
- One state with less rights for Palestinians – 20.5%
- One state with equal rights for all citizens – 6.6%
- None of the above – 25.5%
- Don't know – 10.2%

There is a strong correlation between two-state solution support and age group: 22.7% of the 18-24 age group support a two-state solution, increasing steadily to 47.5% for 65-74 year olds and 55.1% for the 75+ age group. Support for a two-state solution among Arab-Israelis is 57.3%, compared to 33.6% among Jewish Israelis.

2. Of the following options, which solution do you think Israel should apply in the Gaza Strip?

- An agreement for temporary control by an international entity as part of a process that will include normalization with Saudi Arabia in order to reach a two-state solution to the conflict with the Palestinians – 39.0%
- Full Israeli military and civilian control over the entire territory – 30.8%
- Israeli military control alongside Palestinian civilian control – 17.0%
- Don't know – 13.2%

48.4% of self-defined right-wing Israelis support full Israeli military and civilian control over the Gaza Strip, compared to 4.9% of those on the left and center. 70.1% of left-wing and centrist Israelis support temporary control by an international entity, compared to 20.8% of right-wing Israelis.

3. Some claim that “the events of October 7th and the war in Gaza prove the urgency of finding a solution to end the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.” Do you agree or disagree with this claim?

- Agree – 54.1%
- Disagree – 36.4%
- Don't know – 9.5%



4. Of the following possibilities, what are the two main possibilities that would cause you to increase your level of involvement in the Israeli-Palestinian conflict?

If the politicians I support are involved with this issue – 28.6%

Means of increasing my trust in the other side – 24.1%

Means of increasing my knowledge about the issue – 15.1%

None of the above – 21.7%

My level of involvement is high enough – 14.1%

Don't know – 18.0%

39.3% of left-wing and centrist Israelis selected politicians' involvement as a determining factor, compared to 23.4% of right-wing Israelis. 22.9% of young Israelis (18-24) selected increase of knowledge as a determining factor, compared to 5.5% in the 65-74 age group (9.9% among those aged 55-64).
